DISASTROUS FOREST FIRE IN AMERICAN HISTORY, IN WHICH MORE THAN 1,500 PEOPLE PERISHED AROUND PEAKTOW, WIS., IS LARGELY UNKNOWN TO THE WORLD BECAUSE IT HAPPENED ON THE SAME NIGHT AS THE CHICAGO FIRE, OCT. 8, 1871. ONLY 250 PERSONS LOST THEIR LIVES BUT THE CITY FIRE GOT ALL THE NEWS.
