Report of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue.

The report of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue shows that the receipts from all sources, exclusive of the tax on bank circulation and deposits, for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1869, were \$60,039,344.20. The taxes on banks, the collection of which by the Treasurer of the United States has been previously reported, at \$15,907,993.47. The total receipts of internal taxes, therefore, are \$16,594,733.06, nearly eleven millions in excess of the estimate of Commissioner Wells last year.
