Hon. Hamilton Fish:

My DEAR SIR : A few days ago a letter from Mr. Parker, in relation to the "Alabama Claims," appeared in the Evening Post, in which the writer proposes that the individual claimants shall be allowed to negotiate directly, and without the intervention of our Government, with the Government of Great Britain, to recover their money. This letter was ad-dressed to Mr. Frelinghuysen. Last evening another letter is given in the Post, addressed to yourself, after your official refusal to permit the application abroad. Both these letters the Post very carnestly endorses. It seems that the British Ministry had been approached even before you were appealed to, and it was understood they were very willing to pay these claimants. The grounds and illustrations on which the writer and the Post advacate this course are certainly plausible, but, upon reflection, must, I thick, appear fallacious and unsound to a candid, uninterested reader, and perhaps a few words from one who is neither a politician nor a claimant, showing how this proposal strikes his mind, may not




