Railroad Accident at Salem

From the Salem Statesman of May th we copy this: The train due at this station yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, met with what might have proved a serious secident, involving the loss of life, but for the

presence of mind of the engineer in charge.
The accident occurred at the first road crossing this side of Mr. Davidson's tarm house, about one mile farm house, about one mile south of the depot. The following is Mr. Frederiel Gast's (the engineer) statement as made to our reporter: The train left Turner' station as usual, on time, and consisted of eight flat, six box, two stock curs and passenger souch, and at the time of the road in a field known as Pringle's pas-ture, which is an open lot lying on both sides of the track; he immediately whistled on the brakes, and gave the usual signal of warning. The animals jumped on to the track, running ahead of the engine a few rods, when they were caught in the cattle guard placed at the cross road. The breaks were tightened up to stiffen the train, and ea-gine reversed to most the shock—the at the urom road. As it was, both barely essaped. The engineer was thrown through the oab window some twenty feet, landing in a puddla of water, while the debries of the broken cab and cars fell around, fortunately without touching him.
