Washington intelligence says that in consequence of the representation of the British Minister, President Grant has consented to co-operate with the British Government in the suppression of the slave trade in the Persian Gulf, by a treaty with Britain.

The Republican State Convention at Richmond, Va., on the 18th, adopted resolutions re-affirming the great principles of the Republican party, commending the patriotism of Grant, urging his re-election, and proposing Senator Lewis as a candidate for Vice President.

A full delegation to the Philadelphia Convention was selected and instructed to vote for the re-nomination of Grant.
