PACIFIC COAST NEWS.

Frank Pixley is going to stump California for Greeley and Brown.

Gold nuggets weighing two ounces are being found at Bingham canyon, Utah.

The Democrats of Idaho have nominated John Hailey for delegate to Congress.

Mr. H. C. Morse has conveyed an undivided half of his donation claim, embraced within the corporate limits of Vancouver, to Hon. Geo. H. Williams.

Mr. John Robinson of Lewis river was terribly injured by a saw-log rolling over him. It took 15 minutes to extricate him, when it was ascertained that he had sustained very serious internal injuries, so that his life is in great danger.

It is thought that in a year or two Utah will furnish all the lead required in the United States.

Utah crops are reported splendid.

A fire at Fort Whipple, Arizona, on the 11th, destroyed stables, corrals, lay and two horses. Loss \$5,000.

The hop crop of William Wells, of Marion county, will exceed 10,000 pounds this year.

Clear Creek Circuit of the M. E. Church will hold a camp meeting at the Mt. Pleasant ground the second Sunday in June.

The Democratic Territorial Convention, of Washington Territory, nominated Judge O. B. McFadden for delegate to Congress; W. S. Dodge, Prosecuting Attorney, Second District; and John P. Judson, Prosecuting Attorney, Third District.

J. Jefferson, of Portland, was sentenced last week to twenty days in the Portland City Jail for obtaining three dollars by falsely representing himself as the City Jailor.

"Fan him with your boot" has taken the place of "Put a head on him."

Isaac Henshaw, the man on Mill creek who sought death on the cold mountains, and froze his feet in the operation, is now without feet, Drs. Grubb and Hall, of Salem, having cut them off.

Salemites are in ecstasy over a few strawberries raised in hot beds.

The Eugene City Journal says the sa't springs on the McKenzie are fast growing in favor with invalids, and will soon become a favorite resort with those in need of recreation and rest.

Dr. Renfrew, of Eugene City, has lost his reason, and is being taken to Portland, says the Journal.

Eugene City is agitating the question of celebrating the Fourth of July.

The Eugene Journal says the Hon. W. H. Odell entirely used up the "Lion of Lim" in a recent discussion in that city.

The Portland court house block is to have a stone wall around it.

The McKenzie road across the Cascade Mountains will be open for travel this month.

Business is reported lively at Yaquina Bay, and pleasure seekers are already thronging in that direction.

A. J. Boyakin has started a new Democratic paper at Boise City, called the Idaho Standard.

State vegetables are unhealthy.

Four dwellings were burglariously entered in East Portland last week.

Forest Grove Postoffice has been made a money order office.

Ochoco Valley has regular mail facilities.

Fifty-seven pounds was the "heft" of a salmon caught at Oregon City the other day.

Eighty-five pupils attend the public schools in Boise City.

The Idaho Standard of the 5th instant has the following account of a very sad accident: "Last Wednesday afternoon, while Messrs. James M. and Charles York, Mr. Langley and others were looking for cattle and hunting on Man's creek, in Weiser Valley, they came across an old bear with two cubs. One of the party shot and wounded the animal, when she sought cover in the brush. Going in to dislodge her, she charged upon them, when Langley discharged a load of fine shot into her face. This checked her for the time being, when the men busied themselves in getting more favorable fighting positions. In accomplishing this James M. York, while endeavoring to raise himself up so that he could better use his gun, accidentally discharged it and shot his brother Charles through the heart, killing him instantly.

At Boise City, a few days ago, as Mrs. Pitts, wife of Dr. Pitts, of that city, was seating herself upon a stool, preparatory to milking, the cow suddenly turned and tossed her several feet into the air. Mrs. Pitts was thrown completely over the cow, and when she came down was again tossed into the air, lighting on her back as she touched the ground. The enraged animal then rushed at her with lowered head, and would soon have killed her had not Colonel Flournoy, who happened to witness the scene, run to the rescue.

The Payette and Weiser rivers are high, and the Boise booming.

Polk county has 2,224 persons between the ages of four and twenty years.

The peaches and plums of Tualatin Plains have been killed by the late frosts.

Mr. Hutton, of Marion county, has invented a portable tin collar for keeping butter solid and fresh.

A boy named Fleisclam was accidentally shot on Monday night of last week, about four miles south of Gervais. He was chopping wood near the house, and some little children in playing with a gun which was left near the door loaded, discharged the piece, severely injuring young Fleisclam. He is about twelve years of age. At last accounts he was in a precarious condition.

Marion county has a Justice of the Peace who, at one and the same time, sits as Justice in the trial of a criminal cause, acts as attorney on both sides, convicts the defendant, and as Constable conveys him to jail—collecting fees for his services in this complicated capacity.

A black bear was killed within a half mile of Seatt's last Sunday.

At Forest City, Montana, the total snow fall for the recent season was twenty-seven feet.

The late frosts almost entirely destroyed the fruit crop of Puget Sound.

Three logging parties at work near Olympia are cutting 75,000 feet of logs per day.

John Cooper, of Polk county, has recently lost three horses from eating dry wheat, he thinks.

Mark Hoffman has been appointed Notary Public at Cornelius, Washington county.

The Oregon State Agricultural Society offers premiums ranging from \$1 to \$50 for the scalps of animals killed between January 15,

and October 1, 1872. In the award of premiums squirrel scalps will be made the standard, one jay bird being equal to 1, one panther to 50, one wolf to 50, one gopher to 18 and one wildcat to 20.

The Oregon Republican says: The oldest daughter of Lewis Bosley, living near Grand Round, met with a severe accident on Saturday, the 4th inst. While standing near the fire a gust of wind came and blew the flames out under her clothing, which took fire. All the family being some distance from the house, she could not put it out until nearly all her clothing was burned off. Her back is a continual blister from the top of her shoulders down, and around her waist it is literally cooked brown. The skin is all burned off her arms and hands; fully one-third of the skin is burned from her body.

\$8 50 was the amount paid by the Democracy at Dallas to the brass band for a half day's hard tooting.

The mail time from New York city to Portland is twelve days.

Eggs are \$1 25 per dozen at Prescott, Arizona.

Nearly 176,300 pounds of strawberries were received in San Francisco during one week recently.

The gold placer diggings in Brigham Canyon, Utah, are yielding an average of from ten to fifteen dollars per day to the land.

A little boy, aged three years, fell into the river at Los Angeles, Cal., on the 13th, and floated nearly a mile before he was rescued. He died in three hours after.

The Dalles School District has levied a tax of 7 1/2 mills to build a new schoolhouse.

Oregon City Free School numbers some three hundred pupils.

On Saturday of last week an Indian named Cymyoke was stabbed and killed by Indian Charley, back of Stei'acoom.

Thurston, W. T., is to have a \$950 vault in which to store the county treasury.

There were 580 heathen Chinese in Baker county when the last census was taken.

Horses are lying down and dying in Polk county without any premonitory symptoms of illness.

An Eastern Oregon elder explains that John Burnette being a self-made man, and made after the model seen in Indian burial grounds, is, therefore, a wooden man.

The Independent Order of Good Temp'ars, of Salem, have taken the initiative for getting up a grand celebration in that place on the 4th of July.

Rev. L. M. Nickerson, J. Q. Thornton and C. E. Burrows, of the Salem Methodist Sunday School, and J. M. Garrison, C. W. Scriber and Mrs. O. C. Swain, of the South Salem School, are the delegates selected to attend the S. S. Convention in this place on the 28th.

Rumors on the 11th state that negotiations between the United States and England in regard to indirect claims have been broken off, the British Government having withdrawn from the arbitration provided for under the Treaty of Washington.

The house of Rothschilds is said to be weakening. It no longer leads in the great moneyed movements of the day, nor has it the financial ability to control the markets of Europe. The great German credit association of Berlin and Vienna, and other credit associations of Europe, have deprived it of its supremacy.

A man in Detroit threw a club at a cat the other day. The cat dodged and the club struck a child, knocking it senseless, whereupon the father tried to commit suicide, and was only restrained from the fatal deed by the assurance that the child was merely stunned and not killed.

A farmer near Roanoke, N. C., recently discovered in cutting his wheat, eleven stalks in such close proximity that upon examination he found they were all from one grain. The number of grains of wheat in the heads of these stalks were counted, and amounted to 950.
