**PACIFIC COAST NEWS.**

**Geo. Petty, of Eugene,** was recently thrown from a buggy, breaking his arm.

There is much sickness in the **Waldo Hills.**

The **Columbia** was within two feet of the **O. S. N. Company's** bridge last Saturday, says the **Mountaineer.**

A little daughter of **Garnet Riggs,** who resides at **Sublimity,** had her foot cut nearly off by her brother, who was chopping wood.

**Mackey Graham,** a lad aged ten years, was drowned while bathing in a reservoir near **Eldorado,** **Baker county,** on the 9th inst.

The town of **Cornelius,** on the **Oregon Central Railroad,** contains four stores, one saloon, a large warehouse, one livery stable, three hotels and another under way. The future prospects of the town are flattering.

From the **Guard,** **Eugene City:** A few days since, **Zimmermann & Co.'s** mill team ran away, throwing the driver out of the wagon, one of the wheels of which passed over his thigh, lacerating the flesh in a horrible manner. No bones were broken.

The **State Journal** says: "Persons who have visited them say that there are several falls on the **McKenzie,** above the **Salt Springs,** the highest of which are believed to be 300 feet. A trail will be cut from the **Springs** to the falls this season."

There will be a camp meeting commenced on the 21st inst., on the **Coast Fork,** between **Oloveldale** and **Creswell,** under the auspices of the **M. E. Church South.**

**Mr. Elisha Brown,** who left **Douglas county** some weeks ago for **Iowa,** was found to be insane upon his arrival at **Sacramento,** and was taken to the county hospital.

Two saloons have recently been closed out at **Eugene.** It is said two more will follow suit shortly, which, says the **Guard,** will reduce the number to eight.

**Mr. Odell,** of **Eugene City,** has analyzed some of the water from the **Salt Springs** of the **McKenzie,** and finds that it contains several medical properties.

A man named **Garraty,** who recently kicked by a horse, his collar bone and shoulder being broken and other injuries inflicted.

The **Westside,** published at **McMinnville,** says: "Last Tuesday, while the two **James Warrens,** sons of **Wm. Warren** and **Henry Warren,** were engaged reeking rails in the mountains west of this place, they left their work to go to a spring near by for water, and while on their way their dog treed a large panther. The shot it and were engaged in skinning the animal when they discovered its mate within a few yards, waiting for his turn, so they shot that two, and found that their game measured over seven feet each in length."

A young midshipman, named **Henry Francis Sin,** on board the **U. S. Scout,** lying in the harbor of **Esquimault, B. C.,** committed suicide on the 12th, by shooting himself through the head with a Snider rifle. The top of his head was blown completely off and fell on the cabin floor, while the blood and brains bespattered the ceiling.

The **Democratic Territorial Convention** of **Utah** on the 15th, endorsed the **Cincinnati** platform and nominations, but refused to instruct the delegates to **Baltimore.**

The prospect for a bridge across the **Willamette** at **Salem** is pronounced good.

The **Good Templars** of **Salem** have determined not to celebrate on the **Fourth.**

Small houses are in demand at **Portland.**

A man in **Eastern Oregon** is a millionaire in **Confederate** money.

The citizens of **Dayton** are agitating a new bridge to be built across the **Yamhill** river at that place, to cost in the neighborhood of **\$12,000.** Petitions are in circulation.

**Seattle** is making extraordinary efforts for celebrating the **Fourth.**

**Mr. Conkling's** house, on the **Duwamish, W. T.,** was burnt down on the 16th instant. Loss about **\$600.**

In **Clark county, W. T.,** the crops are very promising, and the yield will be heavy, if the **Columbia** does not inundate it again.

By order of the President, dated **April 9, 1872,** the territory lying immediately east of the **Columbia** river, bounded north and east by **Clark's Fork** of said river and the east boundary line of **Washington Territory,** and on the south by the **Spokane** river, has been set apart for **Indian** purposes, and therefore not subject to settlement or sale.

The **Idaho Standard** complains that parties belonging to **Washington Territory,** who reside on the lower **Palouse,** have taken large contracts for delivering lumber and timber, and are now cutting and building large quantities on the **Idaho** side of the line, in violation of law and damaging to the settlers in **Idaho.**

The colored population of **San Francisco** were raising a purse on the 14th, for the purpose of testing the question of the right of negro children to enter all the public schools on terms of perfect equality with white children.

**B. B. Swain,** ex-Superintendent of the **Mint** and a large and prominent business man of **San Francisco,** died from the effects of laudanum on the 14th, which, it is supposed, he took by mistake.

The report of small pox at **Eola** has been denied.

The **Salem Mercury** complains of being disturbed at night by the tinkling of cow bells. The citizens are circulating a petition to have them abolished.

**Sen. Kelley** inclines to **Greeley.**

The **Mormons** at **Salt Lake** are enforcing the **Sunday ordinance** strictly.

The **Idaho Standard** says: **Mr. J. A. Bennett,** of **Payette valley,** had a couple of valuable horses stolen from his farm several nights ago. They were taken by an **Indian** boy that he had raised, in company with a neighboring white boy. No trace of them has yet been discovered, though parties have been in pursuit since the night of the theft.

The **Standard,** **Boise city,** says: The big ditch in the **Willow Creek** mines is running about a thousand inches of water. Miners jubilant, and times will soon be lively.

Track-laying is resumed on the **West Side** road. It is believed that the cars will run to the **Yamhill** river by the 1st of **August.**

The **Christian Messenger** has suspended publication for two weeks.

They have a **Farmer's Club** in the **Waldo Hills,** **Marion county,** called the **Highland Farmer's Club.**

**Cherries** are selling in **Montana** for **\$1 50** per pound.

A select classical school has been opened in **Olympia.**

A cougar near **Seattle,** last week, attacked a young colt and killed it.

A large number of cattle have died in **Montana** this spring from eating poisonous herbs of some kind.

A man named **Clark** was attacked by a she bear in **Boise Valley;** last week, and came near being "clawed up."

The prospect for miners in **Emigrant Gulch, W. T.,** is good this year.

**Ex-Governor Solomon,** of **Washington Territory,** talks of stamping **Oregon** for **Grant.** The **Governor** is an effective speaker.

The **San Francisco Bulletin** strongly favors the building of a railroad connecting the **Central Pacific** with **Helena** and other points in **Montana.**

Freight is now carried from **Corinne, Utah,** to **Helena, Montana,** by mule trains, for four cents by full train and by mule for four and a half cents.

A man named **Dick Voal** was instantly killed by the caving of a bank at which he was working at **Diamond City, Montana Territory,** on the 30th of **May.**

The "striking" mania is reported to have reached the coal miners at the **Lake Washington** coal mines, **W. T.,** and that they have struck for higher wages.

A man named **Sullivan** while attempting to get aboard the train while in motion at **Drain's station,** near **Eugene,** fell between the cars, and was cut in two.

The **Oregonian** says: The next annual Conference of the **Methodist Episcopal Church** for **Oregon** and **Washington Territory** will be held at **Salem,** commencing on the 29th of **August.** This is several weeks later than the usual time. **Bishop Foster,** who was elected **Bishop** at the recent session of the **General Conference,** will preside. This newly ordained **Bishop** has chosen **San Francisco** as his place of residence for the ensuing four years, and will of course devote special attention to the interests of the church on the **Pacific coast.**

A man named **Joseph Simpson,** in a saloon row at **Portland** last Monday evening, was shot in the abdomen by **Charles Grant.** He died soon after receiving the wound. **Grant** was arrested.

A fire occurred in **Ankeny's** brick building, **Portland,** last Saturday morning. **Major Walker's** sleeping apartment was occupied by his wife and an old lady, at the time, the former of whom was with difficulty saved from suffocation. When the door of the apartment was broken in, she was found insensible, and had to be carried out. The fire was subdued, but not before the building was damaged to the amount of from **\$7,000** to **\$8,000.**

A party of forty-nine **Bostonians,** provided with hunting, fishing and campaign outfit complete, were in **San Francisco** on the 16th inst., bound on a summer campaign to **Oregon.**

The daughter of a prominent clergyman in **San Francisco** has created much talk by secretly marrying the door-keeper of the **Skating Rink.**

An organization having been formed in **New York** for the purpose of looting denominational colonies at or near **Puget Sound,** the **Alaska Herald** trusts that the advantages possessed by **Alaska** will not be overlooked, and suggests **Mr. Fairweather** as an initial point, its apex being some 15,000 feet nearer heaven than the locality of **Puget Sound.**

A widow, "fat, fair and forty," sues a wealthy **Cariboo** miner at **Barkerville** to recover **\$25,000** damages done to her heart. **Mrs. Brooks** is the plaintiff, and **Mr. Drinkall,** of the **Forest Rose** claim, is the defendant.

The **Baker City Democrat** says that **Mackey Graham,** son of **Mrs. Graham,** a widow lady living in **Grand Ronde Valley,** went bathing with another little boy in a reservoir near **Eldorado** on Sunday the 9th, and was drowned. He was about ten years of age.

The **Grand Army** of the **Republic** of **Salem** are projecting a movement there for the celebration of the **Fourth.**

The **Salem Statesman** says a couple of the young bloods of that city, surnamed **Nick** and **Moses,** went over to the **Island** in search of berries and became lost. **Moses** like his great namesake was in the lead, and eventually came out on the river bank far above the city.

During the month of **May** the **Walla Walla** Land Office disposed of 11,201 acres of public lands.

Reports from all parts of the country are to the effect that all crops are suffering for want of rain.

On **Saturday,** at **Portland,** a **Newfoundland** dog rescued an insane woman from drowning.

The criminal docket of **Multnomah county** contains twelve cases.

Of the seventy-three papers published in the **State of Georgia** forty-one are opposed the indorsement of **Greeley** and **Brown,** twenty-six favor it but prefer straight **Democratic** nominations, while six are committed to the **Liberal** ticket.

Seven men were killed and many others were injured by a construction train running off the track at **Ford City, Illinois,** on the 17th.
