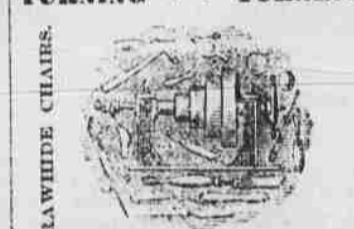

The additional postal treaty between this country and Belgium have been signed by the Postmaster General and Belgian Minister.

Five prisoners escaped from the jail at Trenton, Ohio, May 9th.

Ten companies of the Fourth U. S. Infantry, 500 strong, left St. Louis for Omaha on the 10th. Their destination was supposed to be the Modoc country. Col. Flint commanded them.

A duel was fought near Richmond, Va., May 9th, between John B. Mordecai and Page McCarthy. Both were wounded, the former mortally. The seconds were arrested. A lady was the cause of the duel.

The New York Assembly has passed a resolution appropriating \$3,000 for a full-length portrait of Abraham Lincoln, to be placed in the Governor's room in the Capitol.

The appointment of Minister to Russia has been tendered to Judge Pierrepont, of New York.

Gen. Butler is B. F. Campbell's lawyer against Whitelaw Reid for libel.

It is pronounced uncertain whether a successor to DeLong, Minister to Japan, will be appointed.

A movement toward collecting a fund for the benefit of the family of Captain Hall, of the Arctic expedition, has begun in Cincinnati.

Three more graves have been discovered at the place in Kansas of the Bender murders. On the 11th over 30,000 people were on the ground, and seven car loads of people had just arrived. The country was filled with excitement. Nearly all the bodies were indecently mutilated. It was considered certain that a little girl was put into the grave of her father alive, as marks of violence were found on her body.

Col. C. R. Jennison, a noted Kansas jayhawker, has been arrested by the U. S. Marshal and taken to Topeka on an indictment for an attempt to defraud the Government out of \$2,000 on fraudulent claims.

A dispatch from Washington relative to the Louisiana difficulty says there is no doubt the President would intervene to protect the State from domestic violence should the Governor make application for that purpose, provided facts would warrant the proceeding. It was hoped, however, that no contingency would occur requiring it.

The remains of Chief Justice Chase arrived in Washington on the morning of the 11th, accompanied by relatives and pall-bearers, and were conveyed to the Supreme Court room. Rev. Dr. Tiffany was to conduct the funeral services at noon the next day. The following gentlemen were appointed pall-bearers: Admiral Goldsborough, Gen. McDowell, Senator Cameron of Pennsylvania, Senator Cragin of New Hampshire, Senator Morrow of Georgia, Montgomery Blair of Maryland, W. W. Corcoran of Washington, Gov. Henry D. Cooke of Washington, A. F. Perry of Ohio, Hiram Barney of New York, Whitelaw Reid of New York, Dr. Peter Parker of Washington, and Joseph Kelly and Mr. Schley of Maryland. The pew formerly occupied by Mr. Chase in Metropolitan Methodist Church was heavily draped with black, and the front of the pulpit was covered with black cloth.

The following is from Baltimore, May 9th: On the night of January 2d, Mrs. Mary Ann Lampley, an aged lady, was murdered in this city, and her house robbed of several hundred dollars during the absence of her husband. Some time afterward Joshua Nicholson, who married a granddaughter of Mrs. Lampley, and Thomas Whallo, alias Hallahan, were arrested, charged with the murder and indicted. During the trial Deputy Marshal Frey, and Chief Detective Frey, of this city, testified relative to the confession of murder made by the prisoners. The State Attorney was making his closing argument, when Hallahan sprang around the prisoners' box, and rushing at Frey, struck him violently over the head with a heavy piece of iron, wrapped in a stocking. King Nickerson also sprung out of the box and rushed toward Frey, when a melee ensued. Detectives Porter and Schaffer rushed to the rescue of Marshal Frey, to protect him and secure the two criminals. Hallahan was struck on the head and badly cut—blood streaming over his face. Marshal Frey, although badly wounded, helped in subduing them and they were soon overpowered and handcuffed. After the excitement had subsided, the trial of the case was proceeded with and given to the jury at 1 o'clock, who soon returned with a verdict of murder in the first degree.

The trial of Wm. M. Tweed on former indictments is to begin in two weeks. Fifteen new indictments have recently been found against him.
