PASSED AT THE THIRD SESSION OF THE FORTY-SECOND CONGRESS.

(General Nature-No. 56.1

AN ACT making appropriations to supply deficiencies in the appropriations for the service of the government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and for oth-

Ar purposes.

Be it enacted by the State and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress Assembled, That the following sums be, and they are hereby, appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriations for the service of the government for the state and seventy-three, and for former years and for other purposes, namely:
