FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.

Legal tenders are quoted at 85 1/2 @ 86 1/2.

In San Francisco choice old wheat commands \$1 75 @ 100 lbs., while the new crop opens at \$1 60.

In England, France and Hungary, from various causes, short crops are anticipated, and a slight advance in wheat is noticed. In Africa and Italy nothing beyond an average crop is expected. In Germany the wheat crop is backward but does not seem injured, while the rye has suffered irrecoverably. Should a change for the worse in the weather in Europe occur, a material advance in wheat would transpire.

Liverpool quotations for wheat, on the 16th, were: Common 11s 9d @ 11s 11d; club, 12s 3d @ 12s 6d. \$1 50 @ 100 lbs. seems to be the top price for wheat sacked and delivered in Portland.

Writ of Special Election.

To the Sheriffs of the several Counties within the State of Oregon:

WHEREAS, At a general election held on the third day of June, A. D., 1872, the Hon. JOSEPH G. WILSON was duly elected Representative of the State of Oregon in the Forty-third Congress of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Since the said election, said office has become vacant by the death of said incumbent; and

WHEREAS, By provision of the Constitution of the United States, and laws of this State, it has become the duty of the Governor thereof to issue his writ of election to fill such vacancy:

Now, therefore, I, L. F. GROVER, Governor of the State of Oregon, do hereby command you and each of you to notify the several Judges of Election within and for your several counties, to hold a special election of Representative in Congress to fill the vacancy aforesaid, on Monday, the (13) thirteenth day of October, 1873, and that you cause all proper notices thereof to be given according to law.
