





To the Sheriffs of the several Counties within the State of Oregon :

WHEREAS, At a general election held on the third day of June, A. D., 1872, the Hon. JOSEPH G. WILSON was duly elected Representative of the State of Oregon in the Forty-third Congress of the United States ; and


WHEREAS, Since the said election, said office has become vacant by the death of said incrimbent; and


