### FINN AND COMMERCE.

Gold in New York, 100s.

Since the publication of our last  
number, there has been a decided im-  
provement in the general tone of com-  
merce and trade throughout the world,  
especially in those districts where ship-  
ping is at command. The deficit in  
receipts of bread-stuffs in Great Britain  
has caused a material advance in wheat  
and, to a certain extent, other commodities  
sympathise therewith. It is evident  
to-day, that there can be no great  
falling off in prices of grain for the  
foreign markets, as the leading buyers  
are short. There may be trouble in  
selling in our market, if the present  
cold weather continues, as even now  
vessels meet with great difficulty in  
reaching Portland, on account of floating  
ice in the Columbia river.

The demand for flour in Portland  
continues good, and we observe a grow-  
ing disposition to open up direct trade  
with domestic as well as foreign ports.  
We note large shipments per California  
to Sitka and way ports, small cargo  
to Coos Bay, and purchases for ship-  
ment to the Sandwich Islands, as well  
as to Liverpool. The usual amount  
goes to San Francisco. Puget Sound  
is also buying from Portland houses,  
instead of from California as formerly.

The oats market remains quiet, and  
will, until the crop of California is  
mostly consumed, when we may hope  
for better prices.

Money is comparatively easy in all  
those counties where facilities for ship-  
ping grain have been enjoyed. The  
drain from Portland to the interior has  
kept money tight there, and compelled  
those using more than their own funds  
to pay high rates of interest. A few  
weeks of good weather and an open  
river, will relieve all those sections of  
country that are now without funds.


