CURRENT NEWS.

The Modoc war claims are being audited, and ordered paid. Seventy three thousand dollars was ordered to be paid on the 4th, in San Francisco, for transportation and supplies.

The American Iron and Steel Association met in Philadelphia on the 4th and expressed their views to the effect that the ten per cent. duty on iron should be repealed.

Tweeds Lawyers are endeavoring to press upon Judge Davis a bill of exceptions, to be argued at the next general term.

Several merchants of Brooklyn, New York, are under heavy bonds for alleged frauds upon the Revenue law.

The Pacific Mail Company will soon commence calling at Kingston, Jamaica, on their regular trips.

The Seventh annual session of the National Grange of Patrons of Husbandry met in St. Louis on the 4th. Thirty two States and two Territories were represented by their Masters.

The annual Convention of the National Reform Association was held in Pittsburg on the 4th. The object of the Association is to secure the recognition of God, in the Constitution. Delegates were present from most of the States, and of every shade of religious views.

James B. Groom has been elected Governor of Maryland, to fill the vacancy occasioned by the election of Governor Pinkney to the United States Senate.

London Dispatches of the 5th say: Returns from 16 constituencies where elections were held yesterday show 19 Conservatives and 10 Liberals elected or returned unopposed to Parliament.

Mr Disraeli spoke at Newport yesterday. He said that Gladstone and the Irish policy had utterly failed. Instead of producing tranquility in Ireland, that country was now in a more disturbed state and more stringently governed than ever before.

The pollings at Hackney has been declared void because of informalities. At Staleybridge, Lancashire, serious riots occurred, and many persons were injured.

The Union and Central Pacific Railroads are still waging war on the question of pro rata freight rates. Railroad subsidy bills in Congress, make headway slowly.

The House Committee on Appropriations, think the present force of the Army, larger than is necessary. A riot occurred on the 31 between 1,200 convicts, at Lisbon, and the Intergentes.

A letter from Paris says the general belief in educated circles is that while Prince Bismarck would avoid war by preference, he would not miss a pretext which would give him the appearance of right, and enable him to crush once for all the Ultramontane party.

Recent elections to the Prussian Parliament have demonstrated the extreme improbability of Bismarck's success by purely legal or parliamentary means. The Catholics have gained 35 votes in the Landtag over and above what they had, and the Liberals have gained considerably.

The French Bishops announce their intention to resist any attempt to muzzle them, and Pius IX. has counseled them to fight the good fight of faith, even as martyrs. As a corollary to all this, the Bourse has been falling frightfully during the past three days, spreading consternation in financial circles.

Private letters from Havana say that the situation at Trinidad are regarded as exceptional, and not at all indicative of a general uprising by the negroes and burning of plantations.

The prospectus of the New Atlantic Telegraph Company to lay a cable from Great Britain to Azores and thence to Halifax, has been printed. Advances from Sumatra show that Atchinese chiefs still hold out and are building forts in the interior.

a general uprising by the negroes and burning of plantations. The opinion prevails that the insurgents will soon be able to cross the old Trocha in force. Heretofore they have been able occasionally to cross in small parties. Should they succeed in doing so in large numbers the burning of the plantations is inevitable.

Owing to the trouble between the Union Pacific Railroad and roads running from Chicago to Omaha, on the subject of pro rata freights, several of the largest wholesale grocers and tea and coffee dealers in Chicago have ordered a large quantity of freight shipped from San Francisco via Panama and New York.

Edwin Booth, the actor, has bankrupted.

Captain General Jovellar has issued a proclamation declaring the Island of Cuba in a state of siege. Rebels, and those accused of sedition, will be tried by Court Martial. One person out of every ten will be drafted for active service, for six months. No able bodied males exempt between the ages of 20 and 45 years.

All persons over 45 years of age will have to furnish for mobilization one man out of every ten. Quartermasters will furnish necessary accoutrements to drafted persons, who will receive the same treatment and be subject to the same laws and regulations as regular soldiers.

Those drafted will be organized into bodies of 300, forming two additional companies to augment each battalion. Two-thirds of those drafted will remain in garrison, and the others take the field, accompanied by regulars every six months; one-third in the field will be relieved by the one or other two-thirds performing garrison duty. Artillery and engineer corps will be reinforced in the same manner as infantry. Every male person of age shall be included in the militia, all to be liable to military duty under certain restrictions and conditions.

Free colored people, enrolling in the militia, shall be subject to the same conditions as the whites, and be mobilized in the same manner. Owners of slaves shall give one out of every 1,000 in the Island to work in swamps, fortifications, and in trenches.

At the end of the campaign the Government will liberate all those slaves, paying their owners \$1,000 for each. The proclamation creates a junta for the inspection of all items of expenses of the war. It organizes a vigilance committee in the interior, who will take note of everything, furnish guides, and act as home guards.

Reports from Washington say the Committee on Indian Affairs are maturing measures looking to the re-transfer of the Indian Department to the War Department.

The bill introduced in the House in relation to compensation of post-masters, fixes the rate of New York at \$10,000; of Chicago, St. Louis, Philadelphia and Boston at \$8,000 each; Cincinnati, Brooklyn, Baltimore and San Francisco at \$3,000. It provides that such salaries shall be paid from moneys received from box rents and other sources, in excess of expenditures allowed for rent, clerk hire and other necessities.
