No change in the aspect of the markets since our last quotations, prices remaining about as last quoted.

A much larger breadth of grain will be sown in Linn this season, and with an average crop we will have a tremendous surplus to sell.

Considerable interest is manifested in the improvement of the Willamette river, and it is possible that arrangements may be completed in time to render the river of service in carrying off the surplus grain the coming fall.

FOREIGN. Accounts from Yirout show that the distress from famine is increasing.

A special from Berlin says the German Emperor's health is such as to cause renewed uneasiness.

A transport has arrived at St. Vincent with the first detachment of troops from the Ashantee expedition, returning to England.

The English Parliament met again on the 6th and proceeded with the formality of organization. The oath was administered to members of the House of Commons in groups of forty.

The Anglican Bishop of Ontario has formerly excommunicated Rev. J. B. Stacy, of Ottawa, for participating in the Reformed Church movement.

It was rumored at Lisbon, Spain, on the 6th, that certain inhabitants at Fayal have addressed a petition to President Grant, praying for the establishment of a Protectorate by the United States over the Azores, and that the President replied: "The era of popular will has replaced the era of conquest."

The Daily News says Gladstone has announced his final determination to relinquish the leadership of the Liberal party. It is to be hoped his intention will be modified so as only to apply to the present session of Parliament. A definite decision on this point is expected in a few days.

A special dispatch from the Ashantee expedition says a sharp engagement occurred on February 4th, which lasted seven hours. An immense force of Ashantees, under the leadership of the King, aided by the principal chiefs, opposed the passage of the river Date by the British. Two officers of the Highlanders were killed and thirty troops wounded. The Ashantees were routed with heavy loss. The King and chiefs abandoned the army and took to flight. At the close of the battle Coomassie was occupied by General Wolseley's forces without opposition, at dusk.

The report of the killing of ex-President Céspedes by the San Quentin Battalion is confirmed. On the 27th of February, the troops captured a negro, who was ordered to be shot. He promised, if his life was spared, to lead his captors to Céspedes. His proposition was accepted, and the ex-President was discovered with a few friends. His companions fled, but he could not escape and fired upon the troops, led by a Sergeant, who returned the fire, and Céspedes received several bullets in the head and breast, causing instant death. The body was brought to Santiago de Cuba, and buried on the 1st inst.
