Herman to meet as a nominating convention and place in nomination candidates for Judge and Prosecuting Attorney for the 4th district, and also candidates for the various county offices, independent of all previous party affiliations or conditions of servitude on the part of said nominees. 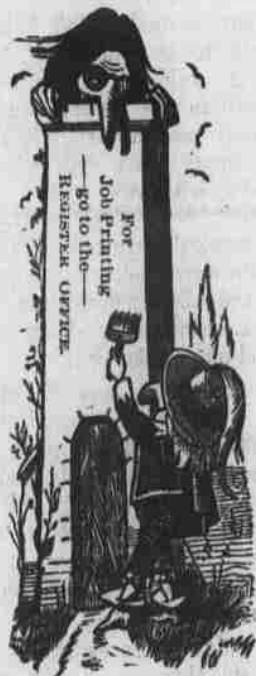
