The latest American progress in building will be the 'mamm th hotel," soon to be erected in Chicago, This enormous hotel is to have a frontage of three Fuglish miles; the height of seventy-seven stories will measure 3.480 feet from the ground floor to the root. The hote will have no stairs; but 500 bat. loons will always be ready to take visitors up to their rooms No room-waiters are to be employed, but visitors will be served by a newly patented automatic, put up in every bed-room, who will do all shaving, shampsoning, etc., to the guests by a very simple and ingenions mechanism. Supposing the gnest requires hot water, the automatic will be able to call down stairs, "A bucket of water up to Room No. 1,003,107," and the water will be up in seven seconds by a pate ted elevator.

Half an hour before table d'hote, instead of the ringing of bells, a gun (24 pounder) will be fired on each floor, to call the guests to get ready for their mea's.

The tables in the dining-rooms will measure four miles each, attendance to be performed by twelve waiters on horsback, on either side of the table. Music during table d'hote will be played, gratis, by eight bands of seventy-seven men each.

For the convenience of visitors, a railway will be built on each floor, as well as telegraph offices. The price of one bed-room will be from \$1 to \$10 The cust of this building is estimated to be \$980 .-000,000. The billiard-room will contain 900 American, 99 French and I English table, and, most of the visitors being expected to be Americans, the billiard-room wil be fitted out with a spittoon of 100 fact in circumference.
