Paradoxes.

Water thrown into a red-hot metallic vessel does not boil, as we should expect, but quietly gathers itself together, forming a more or less perfect sphere, and in that condition floats about gracefully on the hot surface as it slowly evaporates away.

Water boiled in a glass flask until the upper part of the vessel is entirely filled with steam, and then dextrously corked before air can gain admission, and placed in cold water, recommences to boil.

If steam from water boiling at 212 degrees is passed into a solution of salt in water the temperature of the solution steadily rises, passing 212 degrees, reaches the boiling point of the solution; finally the latter also boils at a temperature as high and higher than 250 degrees, according to its nature.

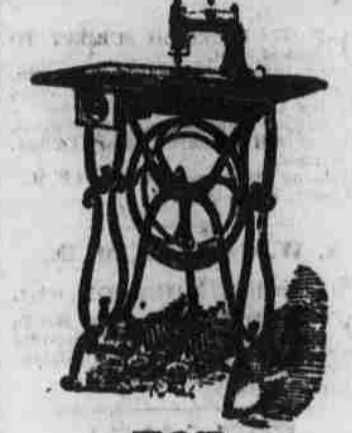
