He called to his son for help, and the young man immediate'y plunged in but the father caught his son by the leg and drew him down, and both were drowned, They were both well known citizers, and their sudden 13ss has created much feeling."

SALT LAKE .- "John," the humorons correspondent of the New Yor Sun, thus describes Salt Lake: "Salt Lake is some miles from the city. I visited it. The name is apropos. Paradoxes.

Water thrown into a red-hot metallic vessel does not boil, as we should expect, but quietly gathers itself together, forming a more or less perfect sphere, and in that condition floats about gracefully on the hot surface as it slowly evaporates away. If at the same time a very vaporizable substance, as liquid sulphorous acid, is thrown in, the water may actually be frozen in the red-hot yessel.

Water boiled in a glass flask nutil the upper part of the vessel is entire y tilled with steam, and then dextrously corked before air can gam admission, and placed in cold water, recommences to boil. The boiling is produced by the cold instend of the heat, and the experiment is known as the ordinary paradox.

If steam from water boiling at 212 degrees is passed into a selution of sa t in water the temperature of the solution steadily rises, passing 212 degrees, reaches the boiling point of the solution; finally the latter also boils at a temperture as high and higher than 250 degrees, according to its nature. There we have the ordinary result of obtaining a higher temperature, say 220 degrees, from a lower one, viz., 212

If there is anything in nature that possesses a positive character, it is light. Yet the physicist may so reflect the light from a given source as to destroy itself and produce darkness. In like manner two sounds may be made to interfere with each other, and produce silence or increased intensity of sound, at the will of the operator.

A MILLINER PRINCESS,-The Pall Mall Guzette, of June 12, says: "Vice Chancellor Malins had before him yesterday the case of Turner vs. Bonaparte, in which a motion was made for an injunction to restrain Prince Pierre Napoleon Bonaparte and Princess Justina Eleanor Nina, his wife, from removing certain pictures which had been deposited with a firm in Bond street as security for a debt due from the Princess to the p'aintiff, Mrs. Turner. It was alleged by the plaintiff's bill that in December, 1872, the Princess agreed to purchase from the plaintiff a millinery business in Bon street by paying £300 for the gool will, and £236 for the stock-in-trade, that the plaintiff had received no part of the purchase-money, although the Princess had entered into possession and carried on the business, and that recently the plaintiff found that the Princess had contracted to sell the stock-in-trade at a large profit. The detendant's counsel said the I rince had not been served with notice; the al'exations of the bilwere denied, and the Prince rcquired time to answer them.
