A valuable horse belonging to R. A. Carpenter, of Hillsboro, died suddenly the other evening.

Several loads of flour have been sent from Summerville, Union county, to Silver City, Idaho, recently.

A letter from Willow Creek, Umatilla county, says grain crops and gardens look well and promise fair yields. Cattle are all fat.

It is reported currently that Mr. Holladay intends sending some of his fine horses to the Fair Grounds at Hillsboro to be put in training.

On Tuesday, last week, a little child four years old, a son of Mr. Donnell, of Umatilla, was run over by a heavy wagon and very seriously injured.

A Umatilla county physician reports more sickness in the county than he has ever known before. Most cases, however, yield readily to remedial agencies.

The Salem Statesman tells of a doctor at Wheatland who was hung in effigy last week because the citizens supposed him to be trying to get up a Tilton-Beecher affair.

Last Saturday week Brown Dick, of Pendleton, and Sturgill's sorrel horse ran over the Baker City race course, 600 yards, for \$300, and Sturgill's horse came off victorious.

The deaf mute recently run over by the cars near Oregon City, and taken to the hospital at Salem, is named L. Morris, and has a wife and one child living in Powell's valley.

A colt belonging to Mr. Henry Woolly, of Hillsboro, ran against a fence rail last Monday, which entered near the last ribs, nearly tearing it wide open. The colt was worth \$100.

There are two companies of soldiers in Wallowa valley. They will scout around for about two months, and should no Indians make their appearance the soldiers will return to Walla Walla.

A Hillsboro physician, who has two handsome daughters, raised a small crop of oats this year. One moonlight night, last week, the aspiring young men of the town went to the Doctor's oat field and cut and bound the entire crop.

Small amounts of new wheat are coming to the Salem Mills, which are not ready to run, so the people are not in a hurry to haul it in. The Mill Company have already contracted to purchase the product of two hundred acres at 70 cents per bushel.

A Lodge of Good Templars was organized at Union Hill, near Sublimity, Marion county, by W. R. Dunbar, G.W.C.T., on the evening of the 1st inst.

Our Washington county correspondent says: The oat crop in the Hillsboro plain is yielding excellent, so far as harvested. The wheat is as good as can be expected, considering the comet. The loafers in town have gone to harvest, but left their dogs.

Mr. E. M. Waite, the Secretary of the State Agricultural Society, informs the Record that there has been over seventy tons of hay cut off the Fair Grounds this year, against sixty last season. The change in the plans of the grounds made two years ago has proved profitable. There will be hay enough to use during Fair time, and about \$390 worth surplus to be disposed of.

The celebrated Virtue mine, of Baker County, is in operation. Forty men are employed.

A novel race is soon to take place on the Coquille River. Each horse will be ridden by a lady.

The Columbia River Transportation Company are building a wharf boat at the Cascades, intended for the Dalles.

A number of gentlemen left the Dalles on Tuesday, for fifteen Mile Creek, on a fishing and hunting excursion.

A new mail route has been established from Bridge Creek, via Ochoo Valley, to Upper Ochoo, in Wasco county.

Mr. Humason has made arrangements with J. H. Chasteen to build the three bridges at the Cascades, included in his contract.

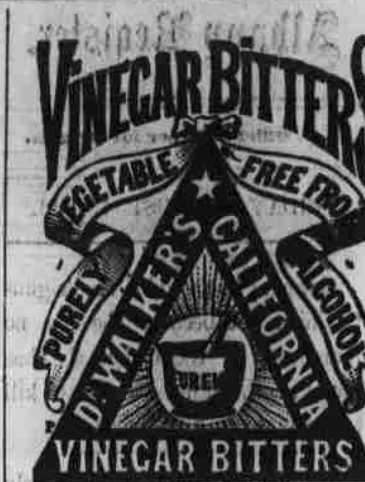
