OFFICIAL. LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES.

PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTY-THIRD CONGRESS.

AN ACT to making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and indicial expenses of $1 \pm \alpha$ Government for the year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hun-dred and seventy-five, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the S-nate and House of Representatives of the United States of Amer-ica in Congress assembled.
