The following rules for ascertaining measurement will no doubt prove inter_ esting to many of our readers, especially in the country, and it would be well to cut it out for future reference :

A box 24 by 16 inches square and 28 inches deep will contain a barrel. A box 26 by 151 inches square and 8

inches deep will contain 1 bushel. A box 12 by 114 inches square and 8 inches deep will contain half a bushel. A box 8 by 81 inches square and 8 inches deep will contain one peck. A box 8 by 8 inches square and 41

inches deep will contain 1 gallon. A box 7 by 8 inches square and 41 deep will contain half a gallon. box 4 by 4 inches square and 41 inches deep will contain I quart.

CHICKEN PIE WITH RICE.—Cut up three young chickens into joints, and drop them into weak salt and water for half an hour. Have ready two quarts BOOTS AND SHOES of rice boiled, but not steamed, into which stir a pound and a quarter of butter, a quart of milk, a little salt, and six well beaten eggs. Put into your baking dish half the quantity of this mixture, and place the chickens and a few slices of A well selected assortment of the most complete ham in it. Then pour in the remainder of the rice and egg, and rub a little flour and milk smoothly together and put it on the top to brown nicely. This pie will be sufficient for twenty persons.

How to Bake Apples .- Bake without breaking the skin. Bake from three to four hours. When the pulp is perfeetly tender break the skin and if it is silken, like the cuticle of the hand, you have your fruit done. If you break the skin baking, the heat and the moisture will escape, and your apple will dry. The peel prevents the evaporation, and is a good conductor of heat. Bake on paper and there will be no dishes spoiled or needed to be washed.

WEXFORD BISCUIT.—Rub ten ounces of butter into four ounces of flour, and three ounces of white sugar, the yolks of CISCO, and will be sold at the lowest market rates two eggs, and a teaspoonful of eider, roll for ready pay, or merchantable produce taken in the paste out thin, and cut with a cutter exchange. into round shapes. Egg over the top of each with the white of the eggs, and sift on white sugar. Bake in a quick oven.


