For the melancholy consequences which ensue from the sale of unwholesome compounds bearing the names of the various spirituous liquors, the powers that be are in some degree responsible .-Deriving, as it does, a large revenue from the importation and manufacture of alcoholic beverages it is manifestly the duty of the General Government to protect the people as far as possible against the introduction of poisons into their daily drink. &c., &c., &c. Still more imperative is the obligation to shield y pernicious excitants, administered as medicines, espection and taxation ought, in this matter, to go hand in hand, and in all cases of adulteration, the adulterated article instead of being taxed containing, or purporting to contain alcohol, should be examined by competent scientific men, and not permitted to go into the market until its purity has been authoritatively certified. The sanitary interests of the community should be paramount to the financial interests of the Government-the public health being of infinitely more importance than the public revenue. But no such protective supervision is exercised either by the central power at Washington or by the State governments. The Internal Revenue assessors and offectors simply demand their tax, knowing nothing about the wholesomeness or unwholesomeness of the article upon which it is levied; the Custom House Collectors insist on payment of the duties equired by law on imported liquors, but how much or how little foreign poison there may be in each will always be found most complete, embracing cask or puncheon it is not their business to ascertain. Congress seems to have entirely overlooked its function of public protection in legislating on the liquor question. State Legislatures have been equally remiss. Many of them have tried prohibi-tion and failed. No one of them, so far as we are aware, has endeavored to mitigate the evils of which they have all complained, by instituting a

igid system of inspection We should be glad to see such a system adopted as an experiment. It would at least prevent unprincipled dealers from paiming off upon the workng classes, to an unlimited extent, the fiery fluids which fill our jails, poor-houses, hospitals, lunatic asylums, and innumerable graves with miserable
