Or Rem Orr, a Chinaman, 21 years in the country residing in Louisana, adressed the Convention. He stated that over 5,000 Chinese are now in the West Indies. Much distress prevails because they were not selected with proper care. He proceeded to describe the habits and peculiarities of the Chinese. He thought them well adapted to southern plantations, the products of China being in many ways similar to those of the Southern States. Koopmanschap also addressed the Convention, stating that his house brought 30,000 Chinese to California where 60,000 are now engaged in general railroad work. They were paid ninety cents to the dollar and ten cents per day, in gold, as laborers, and can be induced to come here for \$20 per month; but they can be obtained much cheaper in China.
