WASHINGTON, Oct. 19 .- The Cuba was libeled. The U.S. Marshal boarded her and demanded the surrender of the ship into his hands. Commodore Higgins declined to surrender, except to an officer of the U. S. Navy, under direct GOODS DIRECT FROM SAN FRANCISCO, order from the President. After some delay Lieut. Commander Pierson, of the gunboat Frolic, went aboard the Cuba and demanded the surrender of the vessel, showing an order direct from the President, for the Cuba to be turned over to him. Commodore Higgins then surrendered his sword and vessel to Commo. DRY dore Pierson, and himself as a prisoner of war to the Navy of the United States. The Cuban flag was then hauled down and the entire crew sent ashore, The affair, in some of its aspects, is regarded here as

an outrage, especially the turning loose in this city of a hundred sailors and marines, entirely beyond restraint or control of officers. In anticipation of trouble a large special police force has been put on duty to-night. Alabama Matters.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19 .- The Montgomery Journal has information from an authentic source, that complete arrangements have been made for paying all the interest of the State debt, falling due on the first of November. The requisite amount has been sent from the State Treasury to New York, where interest is payable. The financial condition of the State is reported healthful.

The resolutions declare the proper place for the Capital to be the Mississippi valley, as the center of the continent. They recite the advantages at some length. The A. J. MONROE resolutions conclude as follows:

Resolved, That while advocating the removal of the seat of Government to the Mississippi valley, we will not serve the MONUMENTS, OBELISKS, TOMBS, of every farmer. It possesses a decided superior interests of any particular locality, but urge Congress to appoint a commission for the national Capital in the great valley of

the Mississini. Resolved, That the removal of the national Capital being only a question of time, we emphatically oppose and condemn all expenditures of money for the enlargethe crection of new ones at the present seat of the national Government, as a useless and wanton waste of the property of the people.
