

BY TELEGRAPH. Surrender of the Cuba to the Government.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—The Cuba was libeled. The U. S. Marshal boarded her and demanded the surrender of the ship into his hands. Commodore Higgins declined to surrender, except to an officer of the U. S. Navy, under direct order from the President.

Alabama Matters. WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—The Montgomery Journal has information from an authentic source, that complete arrangements have been made for paying all the interest of the State debt, falling due on the first of November.

National Capital Convention. St. Louis, Oct. 21.—The Capital Convention adopted a preamble reciting the facts existing at the time of locating the seat of Government at Washington, and the changes which have occurred since.

Resolved, That while advocating the removal of the seat of Government to the Mississippi valley, we will not serve the interests of any particular locality, but urge Congress to appoint a commission for the national Capital in the great valley of the Mississippi.
