When men reject principles and allow themselves to be governed by only selfish motives, their conduct must inevitably exhibit glaring ine it stencies and flat contradictions. This is the fact with reference to the Ralical leaders. Their object is to retain political power at all hazards. and they do not scruple at the means to be used, or as to the pretexts put forth to justify such use. And their course is as crooked as that of a me dranken man, and their positions. at different times, are as inconsistent as possible. For example, at one time they insist that the South are conquered provinces, and the South cin people are to be treated as a conlucted people. Upon this hypothesis the Southern people were not traitors but alien enemies; and could not be tried and hung for treason, because they were not guilty of treason; ye in the very next breath, rerhaps, the Radical leaders insist that these people are guilty of treason and shall be hung for .it. These positions ar utterly inconsistent with each other Men cannot be traitors and alien en emies, at the same time and to the same government. But the Radical take these opposite and contradictor positions; and make the Southern people traitors for the purpose of hanging them, and alien enemies for the purpose of depriving them o their political rights under the con

In a similar manner these Radical treat the States lately in rebellion .-They hold them to be in the Union for the purpose of ratifying constitu tutional amendments-one of the highest and most selemn acts o State sovereignity; and at the same time they insist that they are virtually military provinces. Of course, there is neither principle, justice no statesmanship in such a course; bu a majority of the Northern people have, somehow, been induced to give their assent and support to these contradictory doctrines.
