LAWS OF THE STATE OF OREGON. AN ACT RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF MARRIED WOMEN.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

SEC. 1. That the property, either real or personal, acquired by any married woman during coverture, by her own iabor, shall not be liable for the debts, contracts or liabilities of her husband; but shall in all respects be subject to the same exemptions and liabilities as property owned at the time of her marriage or afterwards acquired by gift, devise or inheritance.

SEC. 2. When any married man residing in this state shall abandon his wife without making suitable provision for her support, and absent himself from this state for a period of one year, the County Court of the county in which such wife shall reside, may, upon her petition setting up the facts of such abandonment, verified by her own oath, summarily proceed to hear the said petition, add adjudge the fact as to third persons; and if such abandonment shall be adjudged thereupon, such married woman, during the absence of her husband, may in all respects contract in relation to, sell, convey and deal with her separate property, real and personal, in the same manner as if she were a femme sole, and may in her own name, without being joined with her own name, without being joined with her cown name, without being joined with her commander as if she were a femme sole, and may in her own name, without being joined with her cown name, without being joined with her construct the real of the summary of the same property.
