

The Democratic party of the United States in convention assembled declare: First—We pledge ourselves anew to the constitutional doctrine and traditions of the Democratic party as illustrated by the teachings and example of a long line of Democratic statesmen and patriots, and embodied in the platform of the last national convention of the party.

Second—Opposition and that dangerous spirit of encroachment which tends to consolidate the powers of all the departments in one, and thus to create, whatever the form of government, a real despotism; no statutory laws, separation of church and state for the good of each, common schools to be fostered and protected.

Third—Home rule, honest money, consisting of gold, silver, and paper convertible into coin on demand; strict maintenance of the public faith, state and national, and a tariff for revenue only.

Fourth—The subordination of the military to the civil power, and a general and thorough reform of the civil service.

Fifth—Right to a free ballot as the right preservative of all rights, and the ballot shall be preserved in every part of the United States.

Sixth—The existing administration is representative of conspiracy only, and its claims of the right to surround the ballot boxes with troops and stationers, and to intimidate and obstruct the election, and the unprecedented use of the veto to maintain the corrupt and despotic power, insult the people and imperil their liberties.

Seventh—The great fraud of 1876, by which, upon a false count, the electors of two states, the candidate defeated at the polls was declared to be President, and for the first time in the history of the will of the people was set aside under threat of military violence, struck a deadly blow at our system of representative government.

THE BURNING PASSION. About thirty years ago there resided a wealthy farmer in Pennsylvania, about twenty miles from Lancaster.
