Washington

(From our regular correspondent.)

WASHINGTON, May 20th, 1887. Soldier boys from Puget Sound, Texas, New Orleans and other points have already arrived, and thousands of others are bowling along over the railroads on their way to Camp George Washington.

The busiest scenes are around the base of the Washington Monument. Scores of men are at work there putting down plank floors for the tents.

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O'BRIEN IN BOSTON.

O'Brien, the Irish Home Ruler, paid a visit to Boston last week. As he stepped from the train he was greeted with cheer upon cheer.

Following is the new vagrancy law passed at the last session of the Legislature, which went into effect on the 20th instant.

Sec. 1. All idle or dissolute persons who have no visible means of living or lawful occupation or employment by which to earn a living; all persons who shall be found within the State of Oregon begging the means of support in public places, or from house to house, or who shall procure a child or children so to do, all persons who shall live in or about houses of ill-fame or of lewdness, shall be deemed vagrants; and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$50, nor more than \$250, or imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten, nor more than 25 days, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

Sec. 2. When any person is committed to the county jail under sentence for vagrancy it shall be the duty of the Sheriff of said county to cause said vagrant to be employed at hard labor during eight hours of each day of said period of sentence upon any public property, or works belonging to said county, or in any other work for the county.

Sec. 3. The Sheriff shall have authority in his discretion to cause said vagrant to be worked upon the public streets of the town or city in which the county jail is situated, for first obtaining the authority from said town or city to do so.

Sec. 4. In the case provided for in section 3 of this act, said Sheriff shall have authority to leave said vagrant in charge of the Marshal, police or other proper city officers during the hours he is being worked, for the purpose of more fully carrying out the provisions of this law.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the Sheriff to at all times have a full and complete list of all persons committed to the county jail under sentence for vagrancy.

Sec. 6. Section 6 of this act shall have jurisdiction of the charge of vagrancy.

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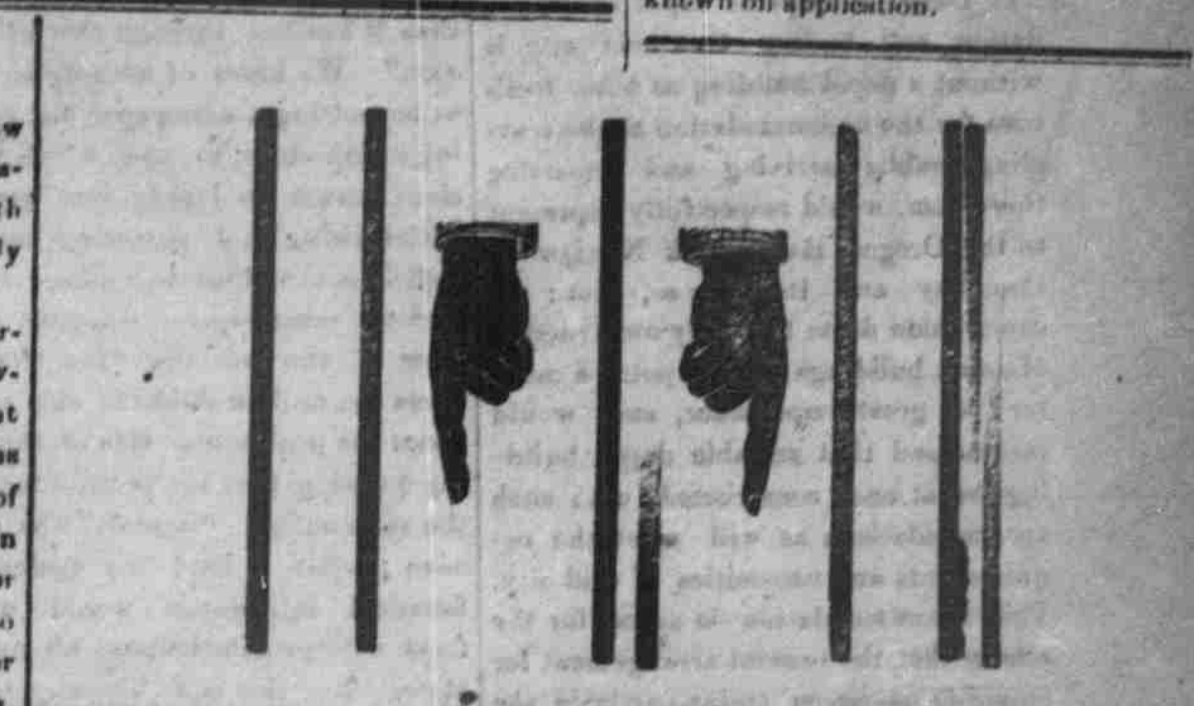
