CALIFORNIA RABBIT DRIVEES.

Rabbits have multiplied so rapidly broughout California that they have become one of the most serious pests of the country. It is estimated that three rabbits ill eat as much as a sheep, and that what can be killed in a day's rabbit drive will ting they get about this nasal twang, and consume as much alfalfa as a hundred beef cattle. A good many schemes have been devised for getting rid of the pests, but the only efficacious one is the rabbit drive. This is considered very good field sport, and a drive is always participated in as much by those who are after fun as by those who want the rabbits killed.


