Hogs, 204,609; estimated value, \$912,760, making a total value of the above named varieties of live stock in Oregon of \$35,-343,075. In making the above estimate horses have been averaged at \$45.86 apiece; cattle at \$16.67 apiece; sheep at \$2.40 apiece and hogs at \$4.46 apiece. Considering that the sheep will clip seven pounds of wool to the fleece, we have over seventeen million pounds of wool for all within the next three months.


