For Yaquina Bay.

Saturday night July 8th, will inaugurate a new and desirable arrangement for the convenience of those wishing to go to the coast. The Southern Pacific southbound overland will bring from Portland on a more sleeper, which on arrival at Albany will be set out on the Corvallis & Eastern tracks and instead of the usual Sunday excursion train for the Bay leaving Sunday morning, the C. & E. train will leave Albany every Saturday night at 11:30 p. m., arriving at Yaquina 2:30 a. m. The steamer Richardson will land them in Newport at 6:30 a. m. and Albany 3:30 a. m. connecting with north bound overland for Portland. Albany and Corvallis passengers desiring sleeper to Yaquina, and return must make reservation on or before Friday. The price for two nights will be \$2. For the accommodation of those not desiring a sleeper the C. & E. will also run day coaches and any Yaquina Bay tickets will be good on this train. The C. & E. have issued a new form of ticket limited to three days, giving the passenger one whole day at the beach. These tickets will be sold every day in the week except Friday, at \$2.50 and will be good on the Saturday night special as well as all other passenger trains. Owing to the reduced price no extension of time will be granted in any case.
