TELEGRAPHIC.

Blockade of Amazon.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 5.—The matter of making an effective blockade in the Philippines, and especially around the island of Luzon, so as to prevent the insurgents from obtaining ammunition and supplies is giving the army considerable concern. It has not been deemed feasible to proclaim a blockade, as it would indicate a state of war and possibly open a way to the recognition of the insurgents.

Admiral Dewey.
GIBRALTAR, Sept. 5.—Admiral Dewey today expressed a favorable opinion as to the outcome of the war in the Philippine islands. The admiral says he does not expect to go out on sea service again except in the event of war, and that he will probably retire under the regulations.

Woman Robbed.
GLENDALE, Or., Sept. 5.—Miss Dement clerk for Mrs. Cotton, in a general merchandise store at Myrtle Creek, a station 22 miles south of Roseburg, was robbed of about \$400 just at dusk tonight. In company with two other women, she had just locked the doors of the store for the night, when she was confronted by a revolver in the hands of a man who demanded roughly, "Give me that sack." She did so and the man and the sack vanished in the dark.

The New President.
PONTO PLATO, Santo Domingo, Sept. 5.—General Jimenes landed here today, having come from Cuba, touching at Cape Haytien on the way. He was received at Waterside by a large throng. His reception was arranged by Gen. Juan Intert, and was enthusiastic. The news of his arrival has been sent to the interior and it is believed settled order and peace will soon be restored.

A New Manager.
CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—The Chronicle says, J. G. Johnson of Kansas, is to be the active manager of the work of the democratic national committee in all of its branches until after the adjournment of the next national convention. Mr. Johnson is slated to assume charge of permanent headquarters that will be opened in Chicago immediately after the conference to be held at the Auditorium a week from next Monday.

Decidedly Hot.
CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—Telegraphic reports show this to have been the hottest September day in all the territory from Colorado to Indiana, and from Kentucky to the Lakes, for 40 years. No fatalities are reported except in this city.
