Late News in Short Form.

Ready to Fight.

LONDON, Sept. 29.—Indications this evening lead to the belief that, in view of the cabinet message, the Boers will probably commit an overt act, which will bring on hostilities before the assembling of parliament. All the latest dispatches from the Transvaal show the liveliest activity on the part of the burghers.

Cotton Panic.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 29.—The wildest panic ever witnessed on the floor of the New Orleans cotton exchange occurred today shortly after business opened, and caused, in the midst of the excitement, the complete suspension of future business pending the investigation of what, at the moment, was assumed to be a conspiracy to swindle the cotton exchanges of the country. The panic was due to an apparent terrific jump in the price of cotton.

Venezuelan War.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—Capt. Hemphill, commander of the cruiser Detroit, cables the navy department from Puerto Cabello, Venezuela, that rumors are current that General Castro, the insurgent leader, has established a provisional government at Valencia, and that the Venezuelan government is treating with him.

Philippine War.

MANILA, Sept. 29.—Gen. MacArthur's column has returned to Angeles, where Generals MacArthur, Wheaton and Wheeler have established their headquarters, with 3000 troops. It is expected they will remain there until a general advance is ordered.

Boers May Strike Monday.

LONDON, Sept. 30.—It is reported that the Indian contingent has scaled orders to land at Delagoa bay. Rumors are current this morning in Johannesburg that the Boers will take the initiative Monday on the border east and west of Charlestown.

Big Strike.

COTTAGE GROVE, Or., Sept. 29.—Jim Potts came in from Bohemia today bringing information of another rich strike just made by himself, Stocks and Harlow on Fairview mountain, about half a mile from the Music mine. A tunnel was run 20 feet and they struck free gold that is visible in the quartz. The ledge is four feet wide.

Grants Pass was visited by a big fire yesterday afternoon resulting in the burning of several blocks and a loss of property amounting to nearly \$100,000. Places burned were the Palace Hotel, Siefert & Smith's fish market, Kessler's jewelry store, Griffith's feed store, Yorum's shoe store, Mallory's restaurant, Pollock's second hand store, the St. Louis jewelry store, Blake's confectionery store, Mallory's barber shop, Lemke's saloon, McArthur's furniture store, Fertah & Co's clothing store, Cornell's grocery store, Smith's racket store, and Dean's dry goods store and several other buildings were badly damaged. Most of the buildings were insured, the total insurance being about \$25,000. 17 stores and 10 ware houses were destroyed.

W. C. T. U. Convention.

The W. C. T. U. convention which met this week in Plainview was one of the very best ever held in the county.

The attendance was large, nearly every union being represented by its general officers and several delegates, the reports were excellent and very encouraging, showing as they did that much earnest intelligent work had been done the past year. The increase in membership in the state has been large but Linn county heads the list with a net increase of 107 members. This entitled it to the services of the State President, Mrs. Kinny, at the convention. Wednesday evening the church was filled, attracted by a medal contest in which seven matrons participated with such credit to themselves that the judges did not find it easy to decide between them. The medal was finally awarded to Mrs. Thompson of Plainview. Thursday evening the state president delivered an address replete with sound, wisdom and solid facts irradiated by a bright wit which charmed the crowded house.
