OUR STONE BUILDINGS .- We are pleased to see the progress made in the erection of these buildings. As course upon course of the splendid cut stone is raised, the designs of the architect and builder begin to be developed.

These buildings are surely the finest cut stone buildings for business houses in the State of Oregon.
