

WE CAN SUCCEED.

What it amounts to.

The Oregon City Enterprise says: "A careful examination of the increase of salaries voted by the Back-pay Congress made by the Chicago Tribune shows the sum actually taken out of the Treasury over and above the sum previously required to pay the salaries of the same officials, amounts in round numbers to a million five hundred thousand dollars a year.

What does this great sum of one million and a half represent? At the rate of five percent, which is the highest rate of interest that the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized by the latest acts of Congress to pay upon one million is fifty thousand dollars a year, upon ten millions five hundred thousand, and upon thirty millions just one million and a half. The salary grab then represents thirty millions of dollars.

It is clear, then, that this swindle has added substantially to the debt of the United States the sum of thirty million dollars. In other words, as the Sun puts it, if President Grant and his Back pay Congress had taken out of the Treasury thirty millions in cash and divided it among themselves the amount thus taken would have been no more than equivalent to the annual charge which their desires have saddled upon the people and the industry of the country.

Let farmers and other working-men think of this. Thirty millions on which they have to pay the interest forever, because the President and the Back pay Congress wanted money to spend and took it, although they had agreed with the people to serve at the old rates of pay and not ask for more.

As many of the newspapers have made malignant attacks upon Senator Chandler and Ferry of Michigan, for not returning their back pay the following letter has been made public, which shows that these Senators are free from the charge. The amount refunded is the difference between the pay allowed under the new and old law:

WASHINGTON, March 28th, 1873.—Sir:—Herewith find drafts on the Treasury, one of three thousand nine hundred and six dollars and eighty cents, payable to Z. Chandler; the other of three thousand nine hundred and twenty dollars, to T. W. Ferry, being avails of retroactive increase of salary passed during the expiring days of and for the forty-second Congress, and this day placed in our hands by the Secretary of the Senate.

"Not willing to gain what we voted against, we request that the same be applied toward the cancellation of any of the six per cent. interest bearing obligations of the nation. Least such return be distorted into possible reflection upon the propriety of our disposition by others, you will oblige us much by giving no publicity to the matter.

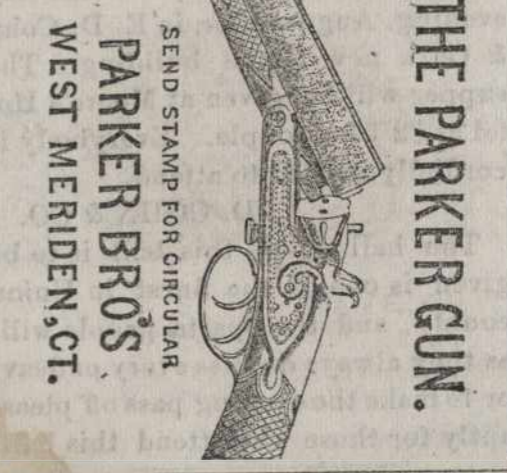
