BONANZAS OF EASTERN OREGON.

A Brief Description of the Prominent
Quartz Mines of Baker County and
their Prospects.

"The Salem Mercury," of April 30th, in
speaking of the mines in Baker County,
says:

"The recent rich discoveries of gold and
silver quartz in Southern Oregon has for
the time attracted the attention of the
newspapers, and the public, to the exclu-
sion of every other section. Let us turn to
Eastern Oregon, and Baker County in par-
ticular, for a brief season and see what it
can show in the way of rich mines and
mining."

"The Virtue Mine, formerly the Ruckie,
is one of the oldest mines in Baker County,
the present company have a shaft down
200 feet below the level of the tunnel and
over 500 feet from the surface when it was
first discovered. They work at present 24
hands, have a 20 stamp mill, crush about
20 tons of ore in 24 hours, they have on the
surface about 100 ton of rock from the
lower level, which is estimated at \$40 per
ton, the vein is about 5 foot thick. There
has been some work done on other lodes
near the Virtue which will pay by judi-
cious management. Mr. E. W. Reynolds
has a good prospect from a new discovery."

"McComb Bros. are opening a very rich
lode 4 1/2 miles west of Baker City the vein
is narrow as yet, but will pay milling, it
has some exceedingly rich pockets."

"Connor Creek District, 40 miles east of
Baker City, is perhaps the richest gold
quartz district in Baker County. White &
Co., are working a lode that is paying
them handsomely, the ledge averages 4
foot, and easily worked and they have
plenty of wood and water. In the same
section Hooyer & Co., have been at work
prospecting on the same lode, with good
results. There are several other lodes
which will be worked this summer."

"In Rye Valley, 45 miles southeast from
Baker City, is the famous 'Green Discovery'
Lode, gold and silver. Mr. Green has made
money by taking rock to San Francisco to
be worked up, they have a 20 stamp mill near
the mine ready to go to work, and with
a lot of ore on hand. This is the only one

out of 40 or 50 ledges in the same locality
which prospects far better than many of the
Owyhee and other ledges that are creating
such a stir in San Francisco. In fact Baker
County abounds in gold, silver, copper, iron
and it is commonly reported that an indus-
trious miner is delving into the rocks on
Burnt River, tracing what he takes to be coal
blossom, the strata is about six feet wide.

"Forty-five miles southwest from Baker
City, Mr. Cabell has a very rich gold and sil-
ver bearing quartz lode, he has a very crude
mill and will not work his best rock, yet he
managed to take to Baker City during the
winter, about \$5,000 per month. In the
same section there are several lodes that
will pay to work, but the holders are
not able to put machinery on them."

"Capt. Wm. Mar in & Co., have a fine pros-
pect from a lode which they discovered
about a year ago, but up to about the present
time they have not been able to put up a
mill for want of means, although the mine
is said to be very rich in gold and silver.
This mine is not over 20 miles west of Baker
City, on water that flows into Powder River."

"In fact, one cannot go five miles in that
section from Snake River traveling west to
the head waters of South Umpqua without
seeing good lodes cropping out, that at no
distant day will be worked with profit. Ba-
ker County and Eastern Oregon are destined
to soon become the richest mining region of
the Pacific Coast."
