IN MEMORIAM.

Last Sabbath evening a telegram was received in this city, announcing the death of James Drake, in Portland, Me. Drake was born in the town of Ayer, in Ayshire, Scotland, on the 12th day of August, 1812, in which town he grew to manhood. In his 22d year he came to Canada where he resided for a number of years, and then commenced a westward course, stopping for a time in Michigan and Missouri, and finally made a permanent abiding place in Oregon. For the last twelve years he has resided in this city, and is well known to us all, and his many generous and noble traits of character will not be forgotten, and especially his aid in the sick and needy of the neighborhood in which he lived.

Several months ago a cancer made its appearance in his throat and growing rapidly worse, he had gone to Portland for medical aid, but to no purpose. On last Sabbath morning at 3 o'clock, surrounded by family and friends, he breathed his last, and on Monday evening at 5 o'clock he was laid to rest, with the ceremonies of the Masonic fraternity, to which he had been attached from early manhood.

Comments on the life of Mr. Drake from our pen would be useless, we all know him, and we all mourn his death. He leaves a widow who has shared his joys and sorrows through the journey of life, from youth up to a ripe old age, she with a daughter and son who have both been married for a number of years, constituted his family.
