Parasites in Sheep. An exhibitor says: Reports continue to come from several parts of the Pacific Coast that sheep are troubled with parasites in the lungs, bronchial tubes, and intestines, often with fatal results.

The small lung worms of the sheep (Strongylus fluvii) live in an embryo condition in water, soil, and vegetation, out of the body of the sheep, but when once introduced into the system they reproduce themselves. They rarely prove fatal to the old sheep, but stock the pastures and young sheep are infected.

In Kansas many deaths have occurred from a thread-like worm in the lungs, for which no remedy has yet been found. Intestinal parasites also seem to be on the increase.

The quantity of butter exported during the same year was forty millions of pounds, valued at \$20,000,000, and cheese one hundred and thirty millions of pounds.
