

LEARN ABOUT THE PULSE.

Every person should know how to ascertain the state of the pulse in health; then, by comparing it when he is ailing, he may have some idea of the urgency of his case. Parents should know the health pulse of each child, as now and then a person is born with a peculiarly slow or fast pulse, and the very case in hand may be of that peculiarity. An infant's pulse is 140; a child of 7 about 80, and from 20 to 60 years is 70 beats a minute, declining to 60 at four score. A healthy grown person's pulse beats 70 times a minute. There may be good health down to 60, but if the pulse always exceeds 70 there is a disease, the machine is working itself out; there is a fever or inflammation somewhere, and the body is feeding on itself, as in consumption, when the pulse is quick, that is over 70, gradually increasing, with decreased chances of cure, until it reaches 110 to 120, when death comes before many days. When the pulse is over 70 for months, and there is a slight cough, the lungs are affected. There are, however, peculiar constitutions in which the pulse may be over 70 in health.

The Mountain Road.

Jason Wheeler returned from the "bunch grass country" last Monday, coming over the mountains on the Lebanon road, says the Albany Democrat. He says there is yet about thirteen miles of snow on the road. It commences near Hackleman's Pass, at the top of the Seven Mile Hill and runs about five miles towards the Lakes. It commences again near the foot of Sand Mountain and runs over that mountain for a distance of about eight miles to the vicinity of Crater Springs. In some places it is yet nine or ten feet deep, but is melting away rapidly. Mr. Gilliland is at work on the road, and is clearing away fallen timber and putting it in good shape. Mr. Wheeler met Mr. Bamford near Fish Lake last Sabbath with a small drove of cattle, and he was getting through without much trouble. Mr. Wheeler says horseman and stock can get over now without difficulty, but would not advise anyone to undertake to cross with teams until about the 25th of this month.

Alfalfa.

A vine grower of California offered within a few days \$800 in gold for a hundred tons of alfalfa hay, to be delivered during the season. As an acre of alfalfa, properly irrigated and occasionally fertilized, will yield an average of a ton and a half of hay at a cutting, and five cuttings in a season, it is no difficult matter to determine that it is an exceedingly valuable crop, and that it should be more extensively planted. At \$8 per ton, the price offered above, and there is no winter but that it is worth more, an acre of alfalfa will yield an average of \$800 per annum. As the land in any of the colonies, with water, can be purchased at \$50 per acre, it will be seen that a farmer can pay for his land in one season. That we do not overestimate the yield per acre of this valuable forage plant, everyone who has had experience in its culture can testify. We know of parties who enriched their alfalfa fields by liberal top-dressing, who secured over twelve tons of hay per acre in a single season.—Fresno Exposition.

Sheep.

Last Sabbath morning 24,000 head of sheep passing through the city on the Burnt river road, en route for Cheyenne. They were all fine, fat wethers, had just been shorn, making them look nearly as bare as the heads of Geo. Clark and Pat Campbell. They belonged to a Mr. Homer, and were purchased in Umatilla county, and yet we are told that they are scarcely missed in that county. A stream of water between three and four yards wide runs past the Reville office. When the vanguard came to this little stream they halted, obstinately refusing to cross over. The sheep in the rear kept marching up until the road was full, every space being occupied by a sheep. It was a pretty sight. The herders, by riding in amongst them, finally succeeded in making those in front jump across, and for about a half hour the air was full of sheep—almost every sheep in the herd leaping over the little stream. It was an animating spectacle, flying rainbow of sheared wethers.

Forest Fires in Wisconsin.

Specials from the region of the forest fires in Wisconsin to the *Republican Sentinel* state that at least 30,000,000 feet of standing pine has been destroyed in Pine River county, and the fire is still raging in the region of the north western portion of Wisconsin and the peninsula of Michigan. Reports from the line of the Wisconsin Central road state that the rain last night has checked the fire somewhat, but doubtless it will be extinguished it. Latest reports from Melville, in the central portion of the state, and where the most serious fires were, state heavy rains have extinguished the fires and all danger has passed. Many million feet of pine have been destroyed, but even the approximate loss cannot be determined.

Valuable Pockets.

The pocket ledge lately found by H. B. Nichols on his ranch, a short distance from Grass Valley, Cal., still holds out nicely. The stringers from which the rich rock is taken were found while ground sluicing, and they are several in number, all pitching toward each other, so that it is quite probable that at a depth of 100 feet or less they will come together and form a ledge. From the first pocket about \$500 was taken; the second pocket about \$140, and now work is being done on another pocket found a few days ago. The last find seems to be more extensive than any of the others.—*Grass Valley Union*.

The coal mines discovered near Pendleton two years ago and from which coal was used all last winter by the business men of that town, are receiving more attention and being developed. Last Friday, the 9th inst., while Chas. Johnson was working in the mines, a part of the

tunnel gave way, falling on him and proved fatal after he was removed from under the rocks. Two men were with him when the accident happened, but could not extend no relief until one o'clock of the next day.

The New Tug.

The powerful iron tug Pioneer, recently bought in Philadelphia by the Portland Tug Co., is being put in readiness for her voyage around the Horn. She will sail about July 1st, and is expected to arrive at Portland between September 20, and October 1. An eastern captain and crew will bring her out.

Republican Convention.

Republicans of the fifth Iowa district nominated Hon. James Wilson for congress on the fifth ballot. There were half a dozen candidates, no one of whom could carry a majority of the convention, and Wilson was taken as a compromise candidate. He made a speech of acceptance.
