Heart Disease not so fatal.

When an individual is reported to have died of disease of the heart, we are in the habit of regarding it as an inevitable event, as something which could not have been seen or prevented, and it is too much the habit, when persons suddenly fall down dead, to report the heart as the cause. This silences all inquiry and investigation, and saves the trouble of a post mortem. A true report would have a tendency to save many lives. It is through a report of the disease of the heart that many an opium-eater is led off into the grave that craves at once his folly and his crime; the brandy-drinker, too, frequently slides around the corner thus, and is heard of no more; in short, this report of disease of the heart is the mantle of charity which the polite coroner and sympathetic physician throw around the graves of generous people. At a scientific Congress at Strasburg it was reported that of thirty six persons that had suddenly died, an immediate and faithful post mortem showed that only two persons had any heart affections whatever—one sudden death only in thirty-three from disease of the heart. Nine out of sixty died of apoplexy—one out of ever seven, while forty-six died of lung affection, half of them from congestion of the lungs, that is, the lungs were so full of blood they could not work. It is then, of practical interest to know some of the causes of congestion of the lungs; these are cold feet, tight shoes, light clothing, costive bowels, sitting still until chilled through after having warmed up by hard labor or a long, hasty walk.—Hall's Journal of Health.

## THE HOUSEHOLD.

To REMOVE OLD PUTTY.—Pass a red-hot poker slowly over it.

To BEAT THE WHITE OF EGGS QUICKLY.—Add a pinch of salt.

To CLEAN TINWARE.—A paste of whiting and vinegar is excellent for cleaning tinware, nickel-plating, etc.

VEAL POT PIE.—Cut in pieces two pounds of veal and boil in water until tender; season and add six potatoes sliced; boil until done and pour in a deep pan. Stir in a spoonful of flour and cover with a crust made like biscuit. Bake a light brown, but be sure to have plenty of gravy in the pie.

DELICIOUS BREAKFAST DISH.—For any family of six take three cups

of mashed potatoes, one-half a cup of flour and half a teaspoon of sweet milk, two well-beaten eggs, and a little salt; mix well together, shape them small and drop them into hot lard, or roll them into little balls and fry them in a wire basket in boiling lard.

## DESSERT.—An inexpensive dessert

is made of one quart of sweet milk, two-thirds of a cup of uncooked rice, and a little salt. Put this in tea or coffee cups, set them in the steamer over a kettle of boiling water. Let it cook until the rice is almost like jelly. When cold turn it out of the cup. Serve with sugar and cream or with pudding sauce.

## ORANGE SAUCE.—For puddings

is made of one quarter of a pound of white sugar, half a pint of water, the juice of one large orange; cut the rind off very thin, so that none of the thick bitter white skin will be out with it; add this to the other and boil for five or six minutes; strain, and, if you choose, add a cup of white or cherry wine.

RHUBARB JELLY.—Take some rhubarb, wipe it with a clean, wet cloth, peel it and cut it into pieces an inch long. To each pound of rhubarb put three-quarters of a pound of white sugar. Put it in to boil for about ten minutes, or until the juice is well drawn. Strain the juice into a preserving pan, let it boil quickly until it clings to the spoon, skim it and put into jam pots or moulds. The quickest way to know if it will set is to drop a little on a plate to cool.

PUFF PASTE.—Mix one pound of flour, one ounce of butter and the juice of one lemon into a firm paste with ice-cold water. Let it stand an hour. Roll it out thin and lay over it one pound of butter in thin slices, fold over the paste from each side, roll it up into a ball, and roll out quarter of an inch in thickness. Fold in three layers and lengthwise in three folds. Let it lie half an hour. Repeat the operation, let it lie ten minutes and repeat the rolling. When used for pies and tarts, rub over the top with a feather dipped into sweet milk.

## ANOTHER WRINKLE IN BREAD.—

In the first place the yeast should be good and free from lumps. After our sponge is very light and has been stirred down two or three times we make up the bread dough, work it a pretty long time and knead in as much flour as it will take. After it has risen we knead it over and let it rise again, and when very light, bake it. We've had no trouble so far and no sour bread.
