By the President of the United States of America, a proclamatiou:

WHEREAS, public policy demands that the public domain shall be reserved for occupancy of actual settlers in good faith, and that our people who seek homes upon such price obstinately refuses to rise. The domains shall in no wise be prevented by any wrongful interference from the safe and free entry thereon to which they may be entitled; and



SHIPPING COIN BY REGISTERED MAIL.

WASHINGTON, Aug 11 -An appropriation of \$100,000 was male at the last session of congress for the transportation of about \$40-000,000 in gold coin from the sub-treasury injury. at San Francisco to the sub-treasury in New York. Owing to the high rates asked by the express companies, the secretary of the treasury decided to transfer the coin by registered mail, so about \$10,000,000 have been transported in this way. The money was mailed in \$10,000 packages. in view, however, of the publicity which has been given to the method of transportation it has been deemed best to suspend further shipments of precious metal for the present.
