America yields 360,000,000 feet of lumber yearly.

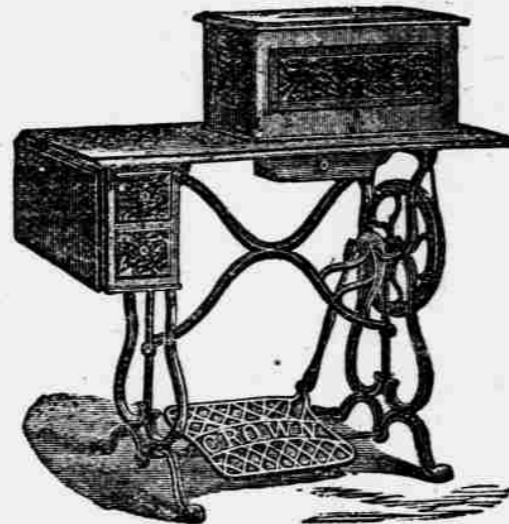

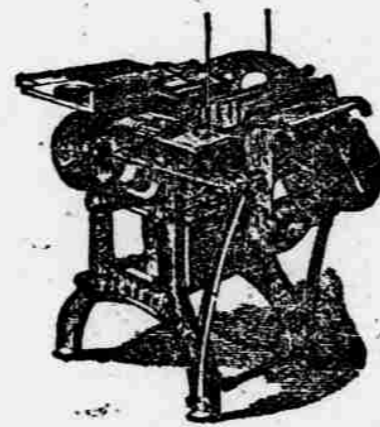
