

PRIZE EDITORIALS.

An editorial contest recently inaugurated by the New York World has developed a fact long known to journalists, that the power of terse, vigorous expression is extremely rare. Of 464 editorials offered in competition, sixteen only were selected out of which the winner was to be named. The others were more in the nature of essay, and as such were valueless for newspaper use. Many of them were well written, but the subjects selected were threadbare, and the manner of treatment hackneyed and verbose. Yet the contestants embrace clergymen, physicians, lawyers, country editors, school teachers, and every conceivable calling. A judge, an adjutant general of a state and a policeman are found in the list of competitors.

The writer who aspires to editorial work in these days of haste and progress, in order to court success, must employ all the arts of concentration. Diffusion is a dead duck in journalism. People will not pause to read long editorials, it matters not how ably written they may be. For such articles they look to the magazines and the reviews.

And yet a good newspaper editorial is simplicity itself. All that required is the employment of ideas on timely topics, the expression of those ideas in clear cut English, and the conveyance of the impression that the writer is familiar with his subject and is thoroughly in earnest in the expression of his views. The truth must be spoken with candor and fearlessness.

As a noted journalist once said to the writer, "It is easy enough to write when one has something to tell his readers. The difficulty lies in trying to say something when you have nothing to say."

This contest of the World's has developed another fact. It shows that men of ability push themselves to the front and do not wait for the opportunity to search them out. That is why that out of 464 competitors not a single editorial was developed that was superior to the ordinary production that would be expected and demanded of the average newspaper writer on two hours notice. It proves that after all our system of society can be relied upon to work the right men into the right place.—Ex.

FISH THAT ARE PROLIFIC.

According to naturalists a scorpion will produce sixty-five young, a common fly will lay 144 eggs, a leech 150 and a spider 170. A hydrachna produces 600 eggs and a frog 1190. A female moth will produce 1100 eggs and a tortoise 1000. A gall insect has laid 50,000, a shrimp 6000, and 10,000 have been found in the ovary of an ascaris. One naturalist found over 12,000 eggs in a lobster, and another over 21,000. An insect very similar to and ant (Mutilla) has produced 80,000 eggs in a single day, and Leuwenhoeck seems to compute 4,000,000 as a crab's share. Many fishes produce an incredible number of eggs. More than 36,000 have been counted in a herring, 38,000 in a smelt, 1,000,000 in a sole, 1,130,000 in a roach, 8,000,000 in a sturgeon, 342,000 in a carp, 388,000 in a tench, 546,000 in a mackerel, 992,000 in a perch, and 1,357,000 in a flounder. But of all the fishes ever yet discovered, the cod seems to be the most prolific. One naturalist computes that this fish produces more than 3,686,000 eggs, and another as many as 9,444,000. A rough calculation has shown that were 1 per cent. of the eggs of salmon to result in full-grown fish, and were they and their progeny to continue to increase in the ratio, they would in about six years amount in bulk to many times the size of the earth. Nor is the salmon the most prolific of species. In a yellow perch weigh-

ing 34 ounces have been counted 9943 eggs, and in a smelt 104 inches in length, 25,141. An interesting experiment was made in Sweden in 1761 by Charles F. Lund. He obtained from fifty female breams 3,100,000 young, from 100 female perch 3,215,000 young, and from 100 female mullets 4,000,000 young.

It holds a power above that of the chief magistrate of the nation, superior to that of congress, higher than that of any state, and equalled only by that which made or can amend the constitution. It can enlarge or limit the prerogatives of the president or the powers of congress. It can change the relations between the state and the nation. It can extend or restrict either the central power or state sovereignty. In short, it can make or unmake the constitutional law of the country. It can introduce radical changes into our form of government. Not only can the supreme court wield these vast powers, it has long done so and may long continue to do so.
