

TOWER OF OBSERVATION .- Four fine sticks of timber 150 feet long have been ordered for an observation tower to be put up on Tabor Heights. It will be thirty-five feet square at the base and ten feet square st the top, and will have platforms every 20 feet, so that people can go as far up as they please. It will be the tallest tower in the world made of single timbers. It will he set on concrete foundations and firmly anchored, so that it will stand steadfast though a cyclone howl through its braces.
