DEATH OF MRS. WORLEY. Sunday the remains of Mrs. T. P. Worley were laid to rest in the Odd Fellows' cemetery. The funeral services, held at the family residence, were well attended by old friends and neighbors and were conducted by Rev. E. J. Thompson.
