

Democratic State Convention. It is recommended that Primary and County Conventions in the several counties be held as follows: Primary Conventions on Saturday, April 23rd, at 1 o'clock, p. m.; and County Conventions on Saturday, April 23rd, at 1 o'clock, p. m. It is expected that in counties where the time thus suggested for holding Primary and County Conventions does not meet the convenience of the voters, the proper Committee will fix a different time.

Mr. Greenbury Fort, of Illinois has at last ceased to think of "crippled Union soldiers" long enough to prepare a bill to regulate the slaughter of buffaloes, and his proposition is a very good one, provided it can be carried out. The bill prescribes a fine of \$100 for each female buffalo killed "by any person who is not an Indian" within any Territory, and a similar fine for every male buffalo killed over and above the number necessary to supply the actual want for meat. It would be interesting to know, remarks the Louisville Courier Journal, how Mr. Fort proposes to detect offenders on the vast Buffalo ranges of the west.

Mrs. Harriet Westerfelt, of Bloomington, N. J., was put into a coffin for burial last week, her friends imagining that she was dead. The undertaker was about screwing down the lid, when the supposed corpse jumped up and said in a loud voice, "My God what are you doing with me?" She was removed from the coffin and placed in bed when she soon after expired.

Hessing, Rhem and several of the distillers indicted by the last grand jury are attempting to make arrangements with the government to plead guilty on some of the counts in indictments against them. They have held numerous conferences with District Attorney Bangs, and rumors are prevalent that they have made propositions to give evidence valuable to the government.

In the case of the government against Samuel Thompson, of Brownsville, Pa., who was indicted recently for removing spirits from a distillery without paying tax, the jury returned a verdict of guilty on the first count of the indictment. The penalty is three years imprisonment and a fine of \$500. About \$75,000 worth of property belonging to Thompson has been seized for violation of the revenue law.
