EAST INDIA GUM EL STIC .- With regard to the conservancy and working of the East Indian rubber-tre s, the yield of which forms one of the most important products of the Assum forests, we learn that there have been three proposals made to government; the first is that government should an-nually sell the right to collect the rub-ber; the second, that the rubber should all be purchased by government; and the third, that government officers should manage the forests. In opshould manage the forests. In opposition to this, however, it is said that much of the rubber is brought in from the forests by wild and half subjugated tribes, and stifl more by tribes that have subjection at all; so that conservancy is impossible, and a government monopoly very difficult. Only two courses seem possible; either to allow speculators to make their own bargains with the hill men as they like, or to enforce an effective government control. Sir George Campbell considers the latter course to be the right one. The exports of caoutchouc, it appears, which amounted to 21,000 mannds in 1871-2, tell in 1872-3 to 11, 000, this decrease being attributed to the closing of the Lucmkipur forests. the closing of the Lucmkipur forests with a view to preventing frontier complications,-Nuture.


