If he were President at this moment, in less than three months we should see our finances on their best feet, taxation reduced a half, and the currency in a sure way to recover, by a gentle and almost imperceptible means.

"What is more we should see the tides of Northern capital flowing into the South to turn its natural resources into unexampled prosperity.

"Tilden inspires all classes with confidence—saving the rogues. Abuse of him does not effect him at all. He has, in fact, no personal resentments, which his enemies say is profound policy, but which I know is the make of the man. He is so deeply absorbed in his principles that he pays no heed to personalities. You might ased in his principles that he pays no heed to personalities. You might assail him for years and at the end of that time, if you were worthy, he would be the first to acknowledge it. When I consider the condition of the country, and his peculiar aptitude to meet the emergencies on all sides, he really seems to me more of a providential man than we have had for a long while.
