Democratic State Convention.

A Democratic State Convention is hereby called to meet at Portland on Wednesday, April 10, 1878, at 11 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating a candidate for Congress, and candidates for the various State offices to be voted for at the election to be held in June next.

The Convention will consist of 140 delegates, apportioned among the counties as follows:
